

IAABO Board 20 Rating Instructions

- ❖ Ratings are to be completed in Arbiter and must be completed by the Annual meeting of Board 20.
- ❖ Rating must be completed in a fair and honest manner and should be kept confidential.
- ❖ The rating scale is based on 1-10 with 10 being the highest possible score.
- ❖ Raters may use the far right column to place any comments that he/she would like to add to the rating. Use the letters listed below for specific areas. After selecting a letter, use the +(plus sign) or a -(minus sign) to further indicate if the comment was intended to be positive or negative. Any area rated lower than 4 must have an accompanying comment.
- ❖ The Assignor has the authority to bring any questionable ratings to the attention of the Executive Committee for review.
- ❖ The ratings are included in the calculation the official's total rating for the season for the purpose of placing him/her for the following season's assignments.

Rating Areas

Personal & Professional Appearance

- A. Wears proper attire to and from the game site
- B. Well groomed before and during the contest
- C. Uniform is clean, pressed and fits properly
- D. Official is physically able to keep up with the play

Manner & Professionalism

- E. Communicates with partner(s) prior to game date
- F. Arrives at game site to allow for an appropriate pre-game
- G. Participates in pre-game conference
- H. Maintains a professional distance from coaches, player and fans throughout his/her time in the gym
- I. Maintains composure in stressful situations
- J. Courteous and business like in all communications
- K. Treats all participants and fellow officials with respect
- L. Supportive of Partner
- M. Works game with enthusiasm and hustle regardless of level of play

Mechanics

- N. Communicates clearly on court using approved signals
- O. Demonstrates proper floor positioning
- P. Handles game with maximum efficiency

Game Administration

- Q. Official adjusts to change of pace throughout the game
- R. Maintains emotional control
- S. Skillful in handling 'non-routine' game situations
- T. Neutralizes emotional changes in coaches and players

Rules Application

- U. Officiates in a manner that is consistent with the spirit and intent of the rules.
- V. Makes rulings that are fair and consistent and allows all participants to play to their ability.
